Purpose and Goals

To increase reading and writing proficiency among students with disabilities

Description Of Students

Four elementary schools, grades K-5, one middle school, and three high schools are currently participating in NCSIP. Students with all exceptionalities are included except for Severely/Profoundly Disabled.

J.T. Barber Elementary has approximately 42 ECP students that

are served through a resource or inclusion setting. **Graham A. Barden Elementary** has approximately 46 ECP students that are served through a resource, inclusion, or separate setting.

Oaks Road Elementary has approximately 34 ECP students that are served through a resource or inclusion setting.

Brinson Memorial Elementary has approximately 78 ECP students that are served through a resource, inclusion, or separate setting.

Grover C. Fields Middle School has approximately 61 students that are served through a resource or inclusion setting.

West Craven High School has approximately 102 students that are served through a resource, separate, or inclusion setting.

Havelock High School has approximately 116 students that are served through a resource, separate, or inclusion setting.

New Bern High School has approximately 161 students that are served through a resource, separate, or inclusion setting.

All eight schools were chosen because of diverse ethnic populations and a commitment to using research-based reading programs.

Description of Instructional Model The Exceptional Children's Program in Craven County has committed to using the direct instruction programs of Reading Mastery and Corrective Reading for grades 3-8. Also Craven County has put in the middle schools an explicit, systematic reading program entitled "READ NOW, POWER UP" that has a progress monitoring technology component. At the high school level, Craven County has selected Read 180 for Exceptional Children's Program students.
